

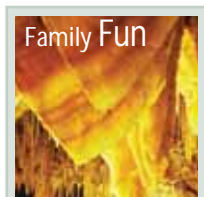


Kids day out!

Busseton to Cape Naturaliste Lighthouse



Head along the Bussell Highway to Dunsborough, take Cape Naturaliste Road to the **Cape Naturaliste Lighthouse**. With only 59 steps everyone can enjoy the view from the balcony. Only 15 minutes drive away is **Ngilgi Cave** where you can take a semi guided tour to enjoy views of stalagmites and stalactites- which one is which? For older kids, you can also take the challenge of an Adventure tour, with the Ancient Riverbed tour great for everyone 10 years and above.

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If you are heading down to Geographe Bay with the kids, there is plenty to keep you occupied and keep the kids busy and smiling! Here is a sample tour with suggestions of places to include- for more information, visit **Busseton** or **Dunsborough Visitor Centres**.

Start the morning in Busseton with a walk along the longest timber jetty in the Southern Hemisphere- at its end you can enjoy a tour of the **Busseton Jetty Underwater Observatory** where kids and adults alike will love the view of colourful coral and schools of fish!

Now that you have worked up an appetite, head to **Swings and Roundabouts** a short distance further along Caves Road. This winery has a great grassy area where the kids can let off steam while mum and dad sample the wine. There are tables and BBQs available, or on the weekends enjoy a pizza.

As you head back towards your accommodation don't miss a stop into **Wonky Windmill Farm**- the kids can feed the farm animals, while mum and dad relax with a coffee. There is also a large grass area for the kids to play.
